The illustrations for the guidebook were made by the author of the famous Pompik the Small Bison – Tomasz Samojlik from Hajnówka. We invite you to travel together through interesting, beautiful interesting, peautiful and undiscovered places!





## Forest Savoir Vivre

or how to behave in the Forest

When wandering along the forest paths, it is worth remembering that you are a guest here. The Forest reveals its beauty to us and delights us with its peace and harmony. Here you will meet thousands of species of living organisms: plants, fungi and animals. In order to maintain a balance between human and nature, we should respect this and try not to destroy plants nor fungi, not to scare nor kill animals.

Proper behaviour in the forest is not so difficult. It is worth paying attention to the information boards. You can find them, among others at educational paths, entrances to the forest, especially in the vicinity of Białowieża, Hajnówka and Narewka.

Also, remember about the signs forbidding access to the forest, which may be placed during forest works connected with tree felling.

# Here there are seven rules:

- park in designated places, do not enter
- the forest by car, quad bike nor motorcycle; lead your dog on a leash;
- camp and light fires only in designated
- in protected areas, e.g. a national park, nature reserves, walk only along designated tourist routes and educational paths;
- keep it clean take rubbish with you, even apple cores or banana skin;
- keep quiet so as not to scare the animals
- do not destroy poisonous and inedible mushrooms, and if you are picking mushrooms or picking undergrowth fruits, pick only what you take with you.








## A must-have for expeditions:

- When going to the forest, it is worth remembering about appropriate clothing, even if our trip is to take place on a warm day, it is worth wearing covered shoes. However, if you are going there after rain or on a cooler day, wellington boots will work best.
- When it comes to shorts and a blouse, it is best if they are "long" to protect the skin from abrasions, mosquitoes and ticks. The latter can be particularly dangerous, so it is a good idea to apply an insect repellent on or spray yourself. Put a baseball cap on your head.
- If you are planning a longer walk, it is good to take provisions with you, i.e. something to eat and water or warm tea in a thermos.
- To get to know nature closer, you will definitely need binoculars and a magnifying glass.

- When going for berries or mushrooms, take a container/basket and a small knife with you.
- A charged mobile phone may be needed in the event of any accident, and the camera will allow you to make a small photo report of the trip.
- A small backpack will be useful to pack all your things.
- A raincoat is a good idea in case of rain.
  - You can also take a map and a pocket guidebook for recognising plants, fungi and animals with you, especially when you are going on a trip without a guide.







## Bison - King of the Forest

The symbol of the Białowieża Forest and the heraldic animal of the Białowieża National Park is the bison – the largest land mammal in Europe. The population of wild bison is the largest here and is constantly growing (over 650 bison). The bison is the largest land mammal in Europe, the largest adult males (bulls) weigh nearly a ton (920 kg). The height at the withers is 190 cm.

A characteristic feature of bulls is disproportion between a huge front part of a body with a marked hump, and a relatively small rump. Cows are smaller, their weight ranges from 320 to 640 kg, and their front body is less developed.

A body of the bison is covered with fawn-brown hair, which blends perfectly with the surroundings. The front of a body is covered with longer hair that forms the so-called beard. Both sexes have high nested horns on their heads. Male horns are thicker and longer and set wider apart than female ones. Adult female horns bend inward more strongly than bull horns. At birth, calves have reddish hair, they are small, weighing from 16 kg to 35 kg. It is easiest to see bison in winter, when they leave the forest backwoods and go out to farmlands in search of food.







## Białowieża National Park

and its tourist facilities

## From the history of the Park...

The year 1921 is considered to be the beginning of the existence of the *Białowieża National Park*, when two of the first five forest nature reserves established in the Forest were created out of the part of the present area of the Park. It is worth mentioning that protection rules applied from the beginning in the reserves met the current criteria of a national park. In 1932 the protected area was given a special name – "National Park in Białowieża", and since 1947 it has been operating under the name of Białowieża National Park.

The Białowieża National Park protects the most valuable natural part of the Białowieża Forest. Visiting the Park, we will see a real forest — a NATU-RAL FOREST — shaped by the forces of nature, such as the fight between species, fires, gales, but not a forest managed by a man. That is why so many giant trees, which do not accumulate in a such abundance elsewhere, grow here. They live up to the end of their days here, so as, as dead trees, to continue to serve, for example, as a shelter or a place for raising forest animals. This forest is made up of many species of trees. Besides spruce, pine and oaks, the most common in other forests, in the Park we can see splendid maples, linden trees with very

thick trunks and numerous hornbeams. The trees here are of different age, so we can observe their entire life cycle – from seedlings to dead trees. Wandering along the tourist trails in the Park, let's pay attention not only to the trees – both living and dead, but also to variety of herbaceous plants and the multitude of species of mosses, lichens and fungi. When we are quiet and lucky, we can meet bison, deer and roe deer in the Park. Meeting a wolf or a lynx is rather rare. We will certainly see woodpeckers and other forest birds on the forest trail. In summer we will meet quickly passing rodents and numerous insects: beetles, butterflies and bees.

This natural forest is home to at least a dozen thousand different species of organisms. They are connected with each other by a complicated network of dependencies. Each of them is needed and important here, having a specific role to play. Even a spruce bark beetle — a small insect which is a pest in a managed forest, nurtured by humans, here — in a natural forest — is irreplaceable. It is the main component of the diet of a woodpecker, which is very rare in Europe — the three-toed woodpecker, which we can quite often see and hear in the Park.

## How big is the Park?

The Park covers an area of 10 517 ha, which is 1/6 of the Polish part of the Białowieża Forest. 57 % of the Park area is under strict protection.





The Białowieża National Park offers over 25 km of well-marked hiking trails and routes and 14 km of bicycle trails. We especially recommend the routes located in the northern part of the Park, where you can move for free. A viewing tower and viewpoints, footbridges running through wetlands are a guarantee of a successful expedition of high cognitive value.

In the northern part of the Park:

## Walking trails:

- → "Szlak wokół Uroczyska Głuszec" ["The Trail Around the Nature Reserve Głuszec"] – red, 5.5 km long;
- → "Wilczy szlak" ["Wolf Trail"] green, 11.5 km long;
- → "Carska Tropina" ["Tsar's Trail"] black, 4 km long;
- → "Tropem Żubra" ["Following a bison"] yellow, 3.5 km long around the Park;
- → Educational path "Przez trzy zbiorowiska" ["Through three communities"] – 0.4 km long.

### Bike trails

Bike trails running through the northern area of the Park are part of the network of routes, which allows you to get to know the natural values not only of the BNP, but also other interesting places of the Narewka Commune. They start in Narewka, where you can leave your car and rent a bike. Further — already by bike — we have a choice of several variants of routes in the form of loops of various lengths, which allow you to visit the northern part of the Białowieża Forest, including the BNP.

Two bicycle trails lead through the Park:

- → green (longer: 7 km from Narewka to the BNP, 12 km around the Park, 17 km back to Narewka);
- → black (shorter: 7 km from Narewka to the BNP, 2 km around the Park, 9 km back to Narewka).

## Bison refuges

Two winter refuges have been established in the northern part of the Park in order to enable the observation of the bison by tourists – "Kosy Most" and "Czoło". Each of them consists of an observation platform situated at the edge of the forest. In the main part of the refuge, in an open space, there are haystacks. In winter, the feed attracts bison and other animals, allowing us to observe them. There are boards with information about the bison on the platforms.

#### Worth knowing!

Individual tourists in the northern part of the BNP can move without a guide. Organized groups of more than 20 people must have a guide licensed by BPN. You can find contacts to guides with the BPN license on page 40.

In the southern part of the Park:

## The route "Do Debu Jagietty"

["To the Jagiello's Oak"] — 4 km long, unmarked in the field, leads through a fragment of the most valuable natural part of the Park, which has been under protection for 100 years. It mainly shows well-preserved oak-hornbeam forests — multi-species deciduous and mixed forests, and a surprisingly large amount of dead wood: dry, standing trunks, scraps, decaying, lying trunks and branches. Along the route, you can see oaks, linden trees, large-sized maples, tall elm trees, enormous spruce fallen trees, mast-shaped pine and beekeeping oak. A wooden footbridge leads next to an alder — a forest with stagnant water for part of the year.

Worth knowing! The walking time on the tourist route "Do Dębu Jagiełły" is approx. 4 hours. The route can be visited only with a tourist guide licensed by the BNP, in a group of max. 12 people; contacts to guides with the BPN license can be found on page 40. Entrance is paid. Visiting this area by horse-drawn carriage or sleigh (recommended for people with mobility impairments) requires the permission of the Park Director.

## European bison Show Reserve and Educational Pavilion of the Białowieża National Park

If you were not lucky enough to see a bison living in the wild, you can see it in the European bison Show Reserve. The reserve is located near the road from Hajnówka to Białowieża, about 3 km before Białowieża. It presents a group of bison, consisting of an adult male, several cows and their offspring. Elk, deer, roe deer and wild boar also live in the pens, in conditions similar to natural ones. Another attraction is the opportunity to see a wolf and a lynx. The reserve also hosts a wildcat and a group of Polish horses. The exhibited species of mammals are complemented by żubroń – hybrids of bison with domestic cattle.

The Educational Pavilion is located in a modern, energy-efficient building located on the area of the Reserve. There is an interactive educational room with 12 stands, the main theme of which is the bison – the symbol of the Białowieża Forest and the heraldic animal of the Białowieża National Park. Using the multimedia presentations you will learn a whole lot of bison facts





- so there is a bit about history, restitution, biology, ecology and the role of the bison in the environment. Touching interactive boards starts spectacular presentations of a given issue. Next to the Pavilion, there is a shelter with bicycle stands and kennels for dogs that cannot be brought into the Reserve.

#### Worth knowing!

The reserve is open every day. In high season (from mid-April to mid-October) from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, in low season, except Mondays, from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

The Pavilion houses a tourist information desk, a ticket office with souvenirs, ticket machines for the Reserve and a cinema room with 46 seats. Admission to the Educational Pavilion is free.

## Nature and Forest Museum of the Białowieża National Park in Białowieża

At the Museum, you will learn about the nature and history of the Białowieża Forest in an attractive way. It exhibits forest communities most characteristic of the Forest: broad-leaved forest, alder, riparian forest, conifer forest, boreal marsh spruce forest. It presents the underground life in the forest, invertebrates, ungulates, predatory mammals and birds. Other dioramas present the world of animals related to the aquatic environment, the role of dead wood in the forest and the diversity of mushrooms. In the historical part, you will learn about the work of a beekeeper, haymaking, processing of wood into turpentine and charcoal, and the function of narrow-gauge forest railways.

Diorama lighting, day and night effects, natural sounds of birds, large mammals, large-format colourful photos will make you feel like in the middle of the Forest.







From the terrace of the viewing tower in the Museum building, there is a beautiful view on the Palace Park, the Białowieża Clearing and the Rezerwat Protective Unit of the BNP. The museum organizes temporary exhibitions. The facility is adapted to the needs of disabled people.

Worth knowing!

The Museum is open: in high season (from mid-April to mid-October) – from Monday to Friday from 9:00 am to 4:30 pm, and on Saturday, Sunday and public holidays from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm; in low season – from Tuesday to Sunday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. The last admission to the permanent exhibition is half an hour before the closing of the Museum.

The permanent exhibition at the Museum can be visited with a guide or with an audio-guide. The duration of visiting the permanent exhibition is approximately 1 hour.

## Palace Park

After visiting the Museum, it is worth taking a rest or a walk in the historic Palace Park, established around the hunting residence of the tsars of Russia erected in the years 1889-1894.

Its area is approx. 50 ha. The main object of this residence was the palace, which burned down in 1944. Only the so-called kitchen gate survived. The complex of buildings accompanying the palace has also been preserved to this day, among others: the Management House, the Marshal's House, the Hunter's House. Chauffeurs' House, the House of Baths. At the place where once stood the palace, today there is the building of the Park Directorate and the Nature and Forest Museum. The park was designed in an English style. also known as a landscape style, by a well-known planner - Walerian Kronenberg. Of the 200 species of trees and shrubs planted here, nearly 90 have survived to this day. On the territory of the Palace Park there is the oldest building in Białowieża – a wooden manor house from 1845 erected for the needs of the Grodno governor - now the BNP Nature Education Center.

In the Palace Park, on a dike dividing two ponds, there is a sandstone obelisk – the oldest monument in Białowieża, commemorating the hunt of Augustus III the Saxon in 1752. On the palace hill there is a group of pedunculate oaks, about 300 years old. The Palace Park is protected as a historic park layout.





## Białowieża Palace Station and Park of Knowledge and Fun

On the premises of the **Białowieża Palace Station**, you will find an original educational playground called "Paths of Nature", where you can combine fun with science. The placement of each element on the playground is carefully thought out.

You will find here, among others, a toadstool carousel, small mushrooms, an anthill, as well as a large spider web that can be climbed and honeycombs created by bees.

Information on separate organisms and their role in the ecosystem was provided in the form of tree leaves. Walking through the Station you will find the Star Avenue of the Białowieża Forest, along which are located tracks of selected species of animals inhabiting the Białowieża Forest – including wild boar, bison, tree frog, beaver and others. Near some stars there are also casts of animal silhouettes in their natural sizes.

In a specially prepared place, you will test your memory and knowledge you have just acquired about the traces of animals by imprinting them in the sand and guessing which animal they belong to.

Along the Avenue and in the Education Zone "Train/Attraction to Nature", interesting educational activities and nature workshops for children, families, school groups and individuals are conducted, presenting the biology of individual spe-

facts from the world of science related to each of the animals. At the Białowieża Palace Station, you will see an open-air photo exhibition.

## Narrow-gauge Forest Railway

The narrow-gauge railway, built during World War I, was used to transport timber during intensive logging during World War I and the interwar period. Since 1991, the Narrow-Gauge Forest Railway turned over a new leaf – passenger transport.

The route of the railway runs deep into the Białowieża Forest, it is an unusual way of communing with nature. The railway works according to the timetable from May to September. In the low season, the ride is possible only for organised groups, after prior arrangement by phone.

#### Worth knowing!

Tickets are sold only on the day of travel, the ticket office is open from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm; beginning of the route: Hajnówka, 12 Kolejki Leśne Street. Travel time (including stopover) 3 h.


## Museum of Blacksmith and Locksmith Craft

Feel the spirit of the four generations of blacksmiths who have worked here, lounge in an old school bench and listen to a museum lesson conducted by the irreplaceable Mr. Stanisław.

Feel free to take notes with a quill pen whenever you feel like it! In the Museum the four generations of blacksmiths have managed to collect a large number of exhibits that faithfully reflect the spirit of the past. The collection of blacksmith tools is constantly being expanded.



Białowieża Enclave is an ideal place for families with children. There are plenty of attractions waiting for you in the surroundings of the Białowieża Forest! In the treetops, there is a rope park, three routes: the red route for the youngest, the yellow route for the elders and the brave, and the blue route for the bravest and most agile. All routes end with zip lines.

Right next to the terraces of the SportBar, you will find a playground with swings, slides and a sand factory. For those slightly older, the Sky Surfer carousel, which raises adrenaline and gives a lot of fun. In the Enclave, there is a beach volleyball court, a football pitch and a badminton court, and in the warmer season, a trampoline, a ping-pong table and outdoor billiards.

At the forest glade, take advantage of a bio-pool, which consists of a swimming section and a paddling pool for children. Thanks to the water heated by a heat pump, it can be used from the beginning of April to the end of October. While relaxing by the pool, enjoy the water, sun and specialties from the SportBar.







Visit the Sensory Park and see what zones are waiting for you:

- The Garden of Sight is made of large perennial beds in the northern part of the park, around a huge oak tree. Each of the beds is planted with plants with colourful flowers.
- The Garden of Touch is a sensory path with different surface textures, such as: gravel, fieldstone, wooden pavement, sand, bark, cones, etc.
- The Garden of Taste, i.e. raised beds planted with herbs and fruit bushes. You can eat plants, touch and smell them.
- The Garden of Hearing with a centrally located

- fountain surrounded by a small reservoir where aquatic plants with colorful flowers grow.
- The Garden of Silence, covered with a ring of thujas, a yard on a circular plan, with a centrally located flowerbed planted with shade--loving perennials, surrounded by azalea and hydrangea flowers.














## Borysówka the Wooden Village





## An area of rest, relaxation and recreation on the Narewka River

In the heart of the Narewka settlement, on the river of the same name, you will find a perfect place for sunbathing. On the sandy beach there placed straw umbrellas which protect against excessive sun or rain as well as benches and wooden tables.

Rest in a hammock or, if you prefer to be more active, use outdoor tables for table football, chess, checkers, ludo or ping-pong. Moreover, we invite you to see one of the largest collections of amethysts in Poland, which has been created for over 50 years. The owner of the collection is a resident of Kleszczele - Mikołai Podłaszczyk, born in Białowieża in 1931, a graduate of aviation at the Military University of Technology. His professional life allowed him to acquire specimens for the collection of minerals from

gallery by Sławomir Smyk. The sculptor was born in Dobrowoda in 1958. He lives and works on the edge of the Białowieża Forest. He is a forester by profession. He calls his carving "opening of wood". In art, he approached abstraction and high synthesis, which is why critics compare his works to the sculptures of the famous Henry Moore. Sławomir Smyk's works have been awarded and rewarded at many exhibitions and competitions.



Ten stops make it possible to learn about the relationship between an eagle and a man throughout history. The boards have interesting pictograms encouraging to learn the secrets of an eagle and the Forest.

→ "Krajobrazy Puszczy" ["Landscapes of the Forest"] (5.4 km) – the path runs through the reserve Wysokie Bagno, protecting a natural fragment of the spruce swamp forest and the valley of the Narewka River. The trail ends at the Forest Education Centre "Jagiellońskie".

→ "Żebra Żubra" ["Bison's Ribs"] (3.6 km) – one of the oldest paths in Poland. It starts at the road connecting Białowieża with the village of Pogorzelce. The route leads along wooden dikes and foot-

bridges through boggy, forest corners to the Bison Display Reserve, where it overlaps with another path – the "Drzewa Puszczy" ["Forest Trees"].

→ "Puszczańskie Drzewa" ["Forest Trees"] (4 km) – the path runs through the Władysław Szafer landscape reserve, stretching along the Hajnówka-Białowieża road. It leads through the broadleaved forests to the Bison Display Reserve.

→ "The Trail of Royal Oaks and Lithuanian Dukes" (0,5 km) — located in the wilderness Stara Białowieża [Old Białowieża], it runs among 150-500-year-old oaks, named after kings and princes who once hunted in this forest. While walking along the trail you will get to know not only a well-documented fragment of the history of the Forest, but also a legendary one on the border of fairy tales, hidden under the roots of ancient trees.

→ "Place of Power" (0,5 km) – this is the most mysterious place in the Białowieża Forest. The area of the former cult of pagan tribes, known for the so-called positive radiation. The atmosphere of weirdness is enhanced by a stone circle and trees of unusual shape (they do not have the main trunk, but a few smaller ones, a lot of joined oaks, hawthorn crowns with branches directed towards the ground). You will reach the Place of Power along the Sinicka Road that branches off from the Hajnówka-Białowieża road.

The canoe trail is equipped with the following infrastructure: camping sites, bonfires and parking places, canoe havens (Narewka, Narew, Lewkowo Stare). You can also go canoeing to Białowieża, where it is possible to organise a trip along the meanders of the Narewka River in the section from the bridge at Parkowa Street to the east to the border with Belarus.
